## Randy Hager Retires from the Physical Plant

Randy Hager recently retired from his position as a Program and Policy Analyst with the UW-Madison Physical Plant. Hager looks forward to new travel experiences in Vienna, Austria with his wife Diane.

Getting involved with new things is something Hager enjoyed in his time with the Physical Plant. Since he joined us in 2007, Hager commissioned several brand new campus buildings, which involved making sure that new systems (such as lighting and heating systems) worked as designed and that they met specifications. Kevin Smith, Engineering Specialist Supervisor with PAC, said, “As an administrator, Hager, oversaw small scale remodeling projects from receipt, working with the design and construction teams through to the close out stage”. Two of these projects were in the Veterinary Medicine and Bock Laboratories buildings.

Hager helped influence new changes in design standards at the state level.

Hager said, “Since 2006, we’ve reduced campus energy consumption by 19%, which includes 3 million square feet added to the campus in new buildings. As part of that program, we have been able to influence the state in terms of HVAC design in new buildings. For example, with the Wisconsin Energy Institute, we have a method of interlocking fume hoods to the HVAC system so that they use less energy if no one is in front of them, or if a room is not occupied. Now that is a standard for HVAC design in new state funded buildings.”

Next steps for Hager include spending lots of time with his grandchildren, volunteering as an usher at the Overture Center, volunteering with his church, and more travel.
